First Methodist Heartbeat: Follow and Shine

I couldn't help thinking about dynamite in small packages after I heard Samantha Boutte's story of what it was like to attend the firefighter training academy and I learned that when you are loaded with grit, determination, and a lot of devotion to God, there is not much that can get in your way. She never had dreams of being a firefighter, but when your prayers open another path and everything lines up completely, you can be pretty sure God has you there on purpose.

Fire academy training is demanding, and when you are the smallest person in your class, and one of two women, you must be ready to hold your own. Samantha prepared mentally by setting two goals. She would not be the last person to finish anything, and she would not show weakness. Samantha prayed and relied on God and adrenaline to get her through. The training was demanding, but the hardest part was being separated from her kids because everything she does is centered on caring for them, teaching them values, and being a role model. Samantha works with hazmat reports and safety issues, and she is training to be an EMT, someday she may be part of the suppression team.

She is on a mission to be the best person she can be, to do what God calls her to do, and to support this church with a willingness to work and give back to the community. Samantha told me she knows when leaving her house every day that she is representing more than just herself, she also represents her faith, her parents, her church, and

her job.

I considered Samantha's journey and how she never expected firefighting to be a part of her life, yet when she looked back, she could clearly see how everything fell into place. I thought about what Pastor Jon said last Sunday when he told us to live into our intended purpose and how God's light is inside all of us and that light must come out. He explained how one person can't shine the light for the entire world, but we can shine it wherever we find ourselves. Samantha prayed, listened, and followed the path to find her purpose and her place to shine, and with her determination and grit, sunglasses may be needed at the fire station.

Dear Friends,

You may be aware that the General Conference (the highest decision making body of the United Methodist Church) has called a special session that will meet February 23-26, 2019. This special session has been called to receive and consider action on three plans regarding the organization of the United Methodist Denomination in particular as to how it relates to our official stance on human sexuality. These three plans have been developed by the Commission on the Way Forward that was formed by the Council of Bishops in April, 2017. The Commission, comprised from United Methodists from around the world had many meetings that concluded in May, 2018 when they presented three plans to the Council of Bishops. These plans will be presented before the General Conference this month. There may be a decision made at this General Conference, there may not.

So that we may be informed and aware of the plans before General Conference, we are having an informational meeting and time of worship on Sunday, February 17, 2019, at 4:00 pm in Rothwell Hall. Much as Bishop Scott Jones did last fall, the three plans will be presented in summary with strengths and weaknesses for each plan. The resources that will be presented are available now on the Texas Annual Conference Website: www.txcumc.org/thewayforward.

Following a brief overview of the United Methodist Church's representation of the three organizational structure, we will share the presentation of the three plans. Following this presentation, we will spend some time with our congregation's mission, vision, and values before we share in worship of Songs for Sacred Discernment including the celebration of Holy Eucharist.

One of the absolute beauties of our congregation as a people is that we have found the way to live beyond our differences and distinctions by placing God's mission to make disciples of Jesus who love this city with the heart of Christ as our first priority. I was told this as I was informed I would be appointed to First UMC and I have experienced this among all of our people in the many places we gather. I believe that our desire to love this city with the heart of Christ will continue grow within, around, and beyond us!
