GUIDING LITTLE HANDS & BIG HEARTS

The ever-enthusiastic Stephanie Denham is our Family Ministries Director.

Stephanie grew up in Beaumont. She and husband, Dustin, have two children, Abigail, 17, and Dylan, 14.

Before coming to First UMC in 2018, Stephanie taught preschool and served as the director of children's ministries at another Methodist church. She works directly for Bishop Scott Jones of the Texas Annual Conference as the Coordinator of Child Care.

With Stephanie, First UMC gained a whole family who saw the

opportunity to serve other families and encourage interconnection between them.

Stephanie gives the children's message and a beautiful smile in the sanctuary each Sunday. The children then follow her to the chapel for children's church. There, she follows the order of worship experienced by the adults.

Stephanie does not "believe in babysitting at church." She teaches the children the meaning of each part of the service and the appropriate behavior during the service. Stephanie also prepares a Sunday School lesson for children and youth each week.

FOCUS ON - JOSH ORTEGO

Josh Ortego serves First UMC in many ways, from singing as a choral scholar and working with our Livestream Worship team on Sundays, to serving as Secretary of the Trustees and on the Sanctuary Improvement Committee in 2019.

When in-person services were suspended during the darkest weeks of the pandemic, Josh and a bare-bones team faithfully assisted in maintaining the weekly message to the at-home congregation.

"I feel like I contribute behind the scenes technically and out front musically. When a plan comes together you can feel it. Those Sundays, the message was spread. Those Sundays make it worth it," Josh said.

Josh came to First United Methodist after being recruited by choir director, Renee Khloes. Josh finds the physical space in our church unique, with an unusual musical space as well, and says the general atmosphere is unique.

Josh is a native of Nederland who graduated from Nederland High School. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Chemical Engineering from Lamar University in 2019. Industry did not appeal to him, so he chose a career as a teacher.

"I'm good at explaining things," Josh says, and he explains things to chemistry students at Silsbee High school.


