FOCUS ON- ROBERT "BOB" MADDEN

First UMC is proud to feature Robert "Bob" Madden – an artist, educator, and long-time church member. Madden was recently honored by the Art Museum of Southeast Texas at their annual fundraiser gala. Additionally, the Dishman Art Museum at Lamar University has included several pieces of his work in their permanent collection.

Madden's 35-year career as an influential art educator has meshed with an equally lengthy career as an artist.

"Sometimes one gets in the way of the other. Sometimes one compliments the other," Madden said when asked about how his careers as an educator and artist fit together.

Among Madden's students who have gone on to significant careers in the world of art are Keith Carter, John Alexander, Marvin Hayes, Dewey Mosby, and Barbara Libersat.

Madden's artistic urges are expressed these days mostly with pen and ink on paper. His work is found in public and private collections throughout Southeast Texas.

Madden is a native of Shreveport, Louisiana, earning a master's degree from the University of Arkansas in 1956. He and his wife Bonnie have attended First UMC since shortly after they came to Beaumont in 1959.




