

A letter from

PASTOR JEREMY WESTER

Greetings Church!

Each of the last three weeks of worship in August, we revisited a miraculous story in Matthew 14 in which Jesus blessed 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish in order to feed well over 5000 people. We read this scripture in conversation with other gospel stories in order to ask a different question each week.

First, we asked "who is the recipient of the miracle?" Each and every child of God because people are not the problem, people are the point.

Next, "how do you make a miracle happen?" Use the gifts you have and trust in the abundance of God for the rest.

And finally, "why should we believe such miracles are possible?" Generosity has defined God from the very start, which is why we know that we are enough, we have enough, God will show up and use us.

The foundation of each answer is not found in personal faith or intelligence - the foundation is God's abundance. I shared this series in part because it can be easy to look at the challenges facing our church and make 1 of 2 common errors. We might look at the declining influence of church in society, the aging demographics of our membership, the declining financial and attendance numbers here, and so many factors working against us and either 1) assume there is no hope so we might as well refuse to change anything at all; or 2) assume it is the past that weighs us down and we need to forget what we've known and try something else entirely.

But God never calls us to quit or to forget. Our calling is to learn how to share the unchanging gospel in a way that a rapidly changing world can hear it. That means holding fast to the heart and soul of what has truly mattered in our community, and holding loosely to everything else. I'm going to challenge our church in November and December to have some deep conversations about what has given us life in the past. Those conversations will shape the ways we gain clarity and alignment around our mission to love the city with the heart of Christ.

All of this work is done with gratitude to the men and women who have gone before us to show us the way. And all of it is done knowing that the impact our church has made in our lives and community is too important to do anything but boldly follow wherever God leads us next. We will seek to trust in the abundance of God as we lay a strong foundation for generations to come!

REMEMBERING FRED SIMON

The Chancel choir is sponsoring a drive to raise \$5,000 in memory of Fred Simon. The bench will be placed next to that of his beloved wife, Gene.

We remember the many musical contributions Fred had made to the church and to the community at large. He sang in our choir. His rich bass voice graced the stages of the Beaumont

Civic Opera, and the Beaumont
Community Players, the Interfaith Choir,
and the Symphony Chorus. We found
that Fred had been singing a Jazz
concert in Wisconsin for years with an
old army buddy, John Harmon. John
is a nationally known Jazz pianist and
composer. Fred had John come down
and join him in a benefit concert for the
choir in Rothwell Hall a few years ago,
and it was a big success. They knew
Fred up in Wisconsin as Soulful Si.

Fred also had many interests outside of music. He received a degree in Elementary Education from Huston-Tillotson College and taught in Beaumont for 43 years. He was a long-time member of the Beaumont Founders Lions Club. His other big passion was Martial Arts, which he first witnessed during a trip to NYC when he was six. Fred began training in Taekwondo in 1956 and progressed to teaching it for many years. A highlight was when the National leaders came and installed him with the 10th degree black belt here in our church. His title became Grandmaster Simon. Even though he was over 80, he actually broke bricks in a demonstration during that ceremony. Fred was the first African-American to achieve that status. During the choir's Christmas Caroling in July I asked him how he was doing, and he replied what he always did to that question "TOP OF THE LINE". He Certainly Was!



Field Trip! - Galveston Central MMC

A group of our church leaders traveled to Galveston Central UMC on August 31st. Central has a long and rich history. Perhaps most noteworthy is a decision made a decade ago by the 4 members who remained. Those 4 members discerned a call to step aside and allow a partner United Methodist Church to try something new in their facility.

What has taken root is an inspiring and innovative community that prioritizes people who are often overlooked. Central provides showers and laundry for their unhoused neighbors. They have

computers and couches for anyone to use. They host a UTMB clinic that provides free medical care. And they purchased an apartment complex for use as transitional housing. Their concrete impact on the community is incredible.

Even more inspiring is the culture that makes the work possible. People matter more than programs. Central is not a community that meets the needs of their less fortunate neighbors; and decisions are not made by one group for another. The gifts, knowledge, and desires of all people are honored from start to finish. And their whole

community has flourished because they honor and value every person who walks through the door.

My hope is that Central will challenge and inspire us to think deeply about how we live out God's calling here. We're not going to become just like Central, but we are going to have to rethink many of our assumptions in order to lay a solid foundation that lasts for generations to come. Our challenge, our calling, our blessing is to love this city with the heart of Christ. I'm excited to see where God leads us as we follow boldly in the season ahead!

Our finance team has been hard at work to better understand our financial realities, find ways to be more transparent with the congregation, and make adjustments to ensure that we are good stewards of the gifts we have been given. A few key highlights -

- 1) We are in a good financial position overall, with normal income of about \$15,000 more than we've spent.
- 2) We are pleased that we have not had to make an extra withdrawal from our endowment income

thanks to the decisions we've made over the last 6 months.

- 3) A few specific savings we were able to reduce bank fees by about \$300/mo; we adjusted our phone and internet account to reduce costs by more than \$250/mo; we'll switch to a new online donation platform and save more than \$50/mo; our utility costs have dropped due to better maintenance; and we're in the process of changing our computer networking set up and save over \$1,000/mo.
- 4) Staff changes and adjustments have allowed us to reduce costs by over \$100,000.
- 5) We still have work to do as we have not yet been able to fund our share of apportionments and we will work to develop a year round generosity strategy that should begin with the new year.

We are grateful for your generosity and your continued investment in all that God is doing through our church family!
